Rights Respecting- Our Why?

The aim of the Rights Respecting curriculum at Abbey is to further embed our children's understanding of their rights and how to keep safe in the world around them. Our students learn about a new right each week and this is repeated throughout the curriculum (L1 - U4) to consolidate learning, with an enhanced focus on safeguarding rights in Key Stage 4. We foster a learning environment where children and young people are encouraged to understand, respect, and practice their own rights and the rights of others.

Abbey School has met the standard for UNICEF UK's Rights Respecting Schools Award at Gold: Rights Respecting.

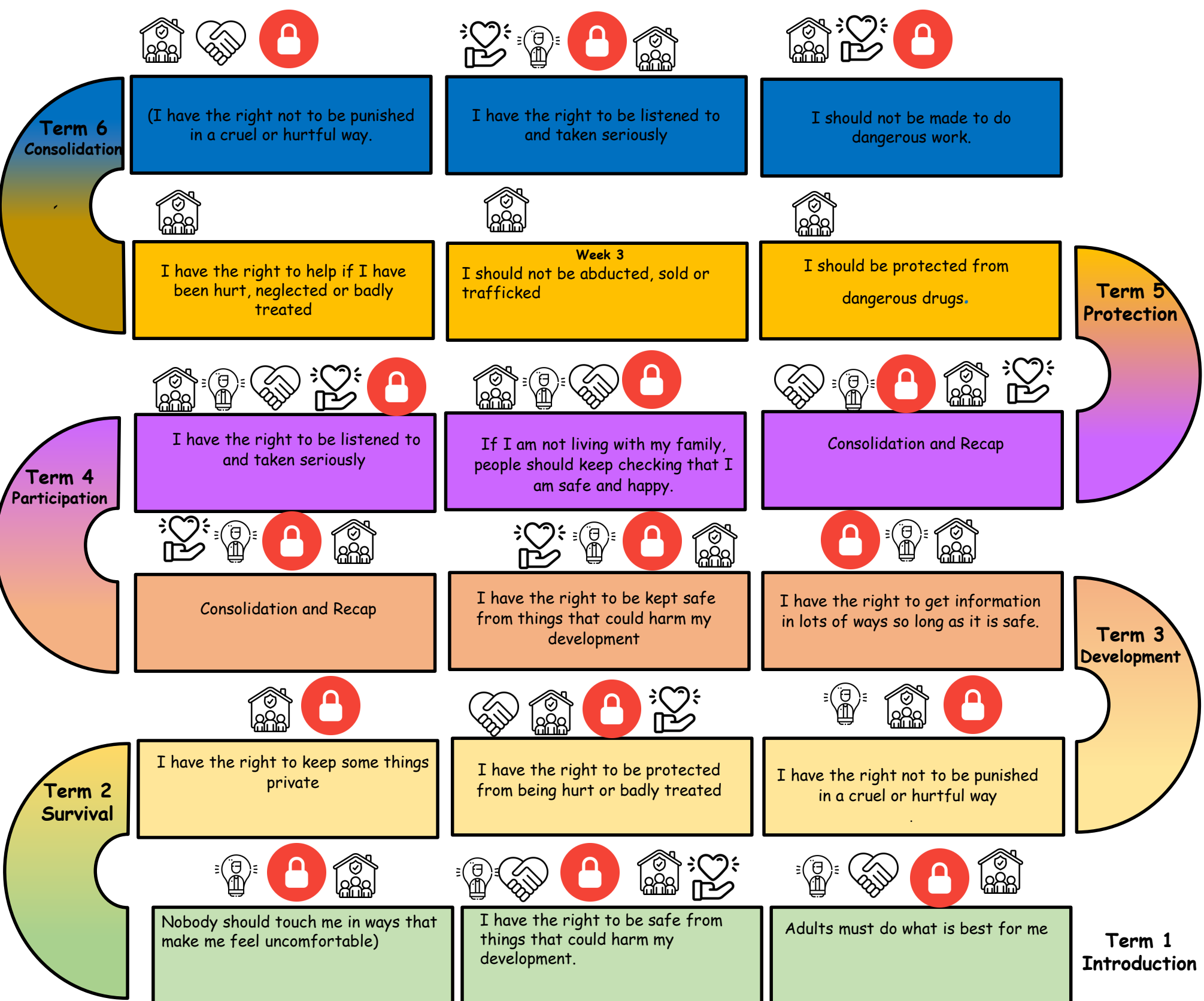


Substantive Concepts of our RR Curriculum
